## **Background:**

Main Idea: Sin leads to suffering.

Caveat: Only part of our suffering is directly caused by our sin.

Read Lamentations 1 and walk through their suffering.

Why do we suffer because of sin?

1. God's Word is always fulfilled (1:5, 1:18, 2:17, Leviticus 26, Jeremiah 4:1-4, Romans 1:18). God is patient, but do not confuse His patience with His permission.

What does this look like for us?

- A. Sin has built-in consequences (Jeremiah 2:19, Genesis 2:16-17, Galatians 6:7). [Colson quote]
  - B. God disciplines His children now (Romans 8:1, Hebrews 12:5-8).
  - C. God judges those who reject Him eternally (John 3:36, Matthew 25:46).
- 2. God's nature demands that He judge sin (1:18, 2:1-3).
- -He is zealous for His own glory (Jeremiah 1:5, 11)
- -He is passionate about justice for others.
- 3. God's Son suffering for our sins is the ultimate proof that sin brings suffering.
  - A. Sin is that serious and God is that holv.
- B. The suffering of Jesus provides the deliverance from sin and eternal suffering.
- C. The reality that Jesus suffered for and with us is the answer to the mystery of suffering.
- -What is our response to this?

- 1. Acknowledge that we are sinful and deserving of judgement.
  - A. Stop blaming others and take personal responsibility for our sin (1:20).
  - B. Stop listening to false prophets who tickle our ears (2:14).
  - C. We have legitimate questions about suffering, but we need to realize that we deserve nothing but death and hell so every blessing is the gift of God.
- 2. If you are not a Christian, repent and believe the gospel so you can be forgiven.
- 3. If you are a Christian, confess and forsake sin (Proverbs 28:13).
